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Gerhard was born in Austria, and attended college and medical school in Vienna. He moved to the US in the late 1980s to run the HIV research laboratory at the University of Maryland at Baltimore and later accepted a job at the Johns Hopkins University starting the development of stem cell gene therapy for HIV. In 1995 he moved to USC's Children's Hospital Los Angeles where he developed clinical grade stem cell gene therapy transduction and cell processing procedures. There he also started with the development, design and implementation of academic GMP facilities. In 2002 he was recruited to Washington University in St. Louis to build and direct a new GMP facility for cellular and gene therapy. In 2006 he was recruited to UC Davis, where he designed and has since been directing the UC Davis GMP facility, manufacturing novel products for 12 clinical trials conducted in several centers nationwide.
